

# **Guidelines for the Upper Guadalupe River Authority Water Professionals Scholarship**

## **Program Overview**

The Upper Guadalupe River Authority (UGRA) Water Professionals Scholarship was created to assist qualified individuals in their pursuit of a higher education and a potential career in Texas water resources management, conservation, or stewardship. The scholarship will be in an amount up to \$10,000 and will be awarded for the 2023-2024 school year. One or more scholarships may be awarded each year. An individual who has previously been awarded the UGRA Water Professionals Scholarship is eligible to reapply provided they continue to meet all eligibility criteria.

## **Eligibility Criteria**

In order to be eligible for the Water Professionals Scholarship, applicants must meet the following criteria:

1. Be a legal Texas resident and a U.S. Citizen.
2. Have graduated from a high school in Kerr County or an adjacent county and/or has resided in Kerr County during the last six years. Preference will be given to students who graduated from a Kerr County high school.
3. Be a full-time student at Schreiner University in Kerrville, Texas enrolled in at least twelve hours per semester.
4. Be a Schreiner University student with the equivalent of at least 60 semester hours of credit by fall 2023.
5. Have a minimum GPA of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale)
6. Be pursuing a degree in natural resources, environmental science, engineering, chemistry, biology, education, or similar with emphasis on water resources management.
7. Submit the completed UGRA Water Professionals Scholarship application (Exhibit A) prior to March 17, 2023.
8. Be available to complete an interview with the UGRA Outreach and Education Committee when requested.
9. Be available and complete 45 hours during the spring and fall semester (90 hours total) as an unpaid UGRA intern assisting the Natural Resources or Environmental Laboratory Departments in fulfilling the mission of UGRA.

## **Selection and Award Process**

Scholarship recipients are selected based on academic achievement, leadership, community activities, personal essays, letters of recommendation, and potential to succeed in a water resources related career in Texas.

The UGRA Outreach and Education Committee will select the scholarship recipient (subject to the approval of the UGRA Board of Directors). No member of the UGRA Board of Directors or their immediate families shall be eligible for the scholarship during their tenure on the UGRA Board. The Outreach and Education Committee and the UGRA Board of Directors have the sole discretion for selecting recipients based on the criteria set forth in these guidelines. UGRA retains the right to withhold scholarship awards in any year if no candidate is determined to be qualified. Previous UGRA Water Professionals Scholarship recipients can reapply for a second scholarship, but students are only eligible to be awarded the scholarship twice.

UGRA shall notify the chosen scholarship recipient(s) of its decision after the May meeting of the UGRA Board of Directors. The first scholarship payment of up to \$5,000 will be made after UGRA verifies that the selected student is enrolled full-time at Schreiner University for the 2023-2024 school year and the student has committed to complete the 45-hour internship during the fall semester. This information must be verified and received by UGRA by August 1<sup>st</sup>.

The second payment of up to \$5,000 will be made after the student submits an updated transcript to UGRA demonstrating the maintenance of a 3.0 GPA or better and completion of course work, proof of enrollment for the spring semester, and a commitment to complete the remaining 45-hour internship during the spring semester. This information must be verified and received by UGRA by January 9<sup>th</sup>.

All scholarship checks will be made payable to Schreiner University for the student and will be distributed in accordance with the university financial aid department. Scholarship checks will not be given to the recipients. Acceptance of the scholarship constitutes permission for UGRA to promote the name and/or likeness of scholarship recipient.

UGRA reserves the right to reject any application based on fraud, irregularities, lack of budgeted funds, or otherwise as determined in UGRA's sole discretion. The scholarship is funded with monies budgeted for the program by the UGRA Board of Directors and no other monies will be utilized for payment. The scholarship will be awarded without regard to race, gender, national origin, disability, or religion.

### **Renewal, Modification, or Termination of Program**

The UGRA Outreach and Education Committee will review the scholarship program guidelines and budget annually and recommend significant modifications to the Board as needed. The Board of Directors of UGRA may determine in its sole and absolute discretion whether to renew, modify, or terminate this scholarship program at any time, and nothing herein shall be construed to grant any person any vested right to payment from UGRA.
