Representative Harvey Hilderbran Speaks to UGRA Board of Directors

The Board of Directors of the Upper Guadalupe River Authority (UGRA) welcomed Representative Harvey Hilderbran to the regularly scheduled board meeting on Wednesday, January 25, 2012. Representative Hilderbran was invited to speak about his current committee assignments, interim charges, and how UGRA and he can work together to ensure the preservation and protection of our water resources and to ensure that Kerr County has adequate water supplies for the future.
